## Resources employers welcome Josh Frydenberg's sensible approach to energy debate

AUSTRALIA'S Resources and Energy Group AMMA commends Energy Minister Josh Frydenberg for seeking to end ideological influences in the debate around the security and affordability of Australia's energy supplies.

"Minister Frydenberg is right in characterising the national energy debate as no longer being an economic debate, but worryingly also turning into a cultural and ideological debate," said AMMA chief executive Steve Knott.

"Such an approach will also give the business community confidence and allow it to grow, create jobs and drive our economy."
